Chestnut Class Topic – World War 2

Complete at least two activities by **Wednesday 6th April 2022**

We are having a World War 2 day on **Monday 21st March**. Children may come into school dressed for the occasion, such as an evacuee, a member of the forces, someone from the land army, or even Captain Mainwaring! War recipes made for homework can be brought in and shared on this day – see the Design Technology section below.

Literacy

- ❖ Imagine you have been evacuated – write a letter home to your parents.
- ❖ Write a biography about a significant individual from the Second World War.
- ❖ Make a newspaper report of a bombing on your street.

Maths

- ❖ Create a graph comparing the size of armies from different nations.

Design Technology

- ❖ Research and make a recipe from WW2. **If you want, you can bring it to the WW2 day we are having on Monday 21st March.**
- ❖ Design a model of an air raid shelter.
- ❖ Make a model of an air raid shelter. It could be an Anderson, a Morrison, or even your own version of a public one, like an underground station.
- ❖ Design and test a parachute that would allow a member of the RAF to land safely.
- ❖ Draw and label a great airplane from WW2 e.g. Supermarine Spitfire, Avro Lancaster.
- ❖ Research a WW2 recipe and make it at home.

History

- ❖ Research and write 10 facts about Anne Frank.
- ❖ Create a timeline of events that happened during World War 2.

Art

- ❖ Make a painting, drawing or collage about a Second World War scene.
- ❖ Research war propaganda posters and create your own.

PE

- ❖ Research popular dances from WW2. Film yourself having a go at one you have learnt.

Don't forget to read regularly (at least 20 minutes per day - recording it in your reading diaries) and practise your times tables.

You will also be given weekly spellings to learn and practise.
