# A Helen Foundation supported workshop facilitated by Daisi (a Devon Arts charity)

## Friday 10th and Friday 24th June

To enrich our Arts curriculum, we like to offer our children the opportunity to take part in workshops led by professional artists. This month we are delighted to welcome the artist James Hedge into school to teach the children in KS2 about drawing with shade and perspective. This has been made possible by funding provided by The Helen Foundation charity based in Teignmouth, who have provided years of support to us in Kenton, and which we are always very grateful for.



The Helen Foundation was launched in January 2006 as a living memorial to <u>Helen Elizabeth Kirk</u>, aged 24, who tragically died after a road accident on 26 December 2005. Following her untimely death, her family and her boyfriend, Ben, decided to set up The Helen Foundation as a new charitable trust in order to support the aspirations of young people in the arts who live in Teignbridge (the part of Devon where Helen grew up and that she loved so much), especially those lacking financial support. The Helen Foundation encourages and supports young people to develop their talents and to pursue their ambitions in the arts as Helen was able to.
